It's just the kind of thing for which the advent season prepares us.

Because advent is not just about the *act* of waiting, it's about *how* we do it.

- We actively wait, preparing our hearts to receive our savior, committing our lives to making his way in the world.
- We wait leaning in, in full anticipation of his arrival because that's what he said he would do and we learned long ago and have experienced time and again without fail, that he is true to his Word.
- And we hope. Our waiting is grounded in the bedrock belief that the saving love of God for us cannot and will not be denied.

It's a lesson in waiting that has application for us, not only with the pause on our associate pastor search but throughout the rest of our lives as well.

What's the individual wait that you carry these days?

Whatever it is, as we step into this season together, may all our waiting be filled with purpose and confidence, knowing that the glorious episodes we have seen from the One for whom we ultimately wait are but a hint of that which is to come.

## Session Decides to Pause Associate Pastor Search

After reviewing the budget for 2023, at a special November 15 called meeting, the Session discerned it was in the best interest of the congregation to put a pause on the search process for our next full time associate pastor.

While pledges and giving were faithful and consistent throughout the pandemic, they were not able to keep pace with rising costs. We were fortunate to receive PPP grants from the federal government in 2020 and 2021, which bridged that gap but we now find ourselves needing to increase our revenues in order to resume our two pastor leadership model.

Reflecting the session's commitment to this model, a line item for the associate pastor position will remain in the budget to keep our goal in front of us and allow us to track our progress (as soon as the deficit reaches zero, we're where we need to be!).

In the meantime, God has blessed us through the ministry that Rob Carlson brings in his 10 hour/week Parish Associate role and the Session is committed to seeking additional part-time assistance for pastoral coverage. These costs will be taken against the Associate Pastor salary line item in the budget.


The Session is confident that with the prayerful discernment, continued generosity and faithful efforts of the entire congregation, the way will be made clear in God's good time.

# Welcome to FPC-Holt's New Bell Director: Jonathan Korpi!



Jonathan Korpi was born and raised in Michigan's Upper Peninsula in the small mining town of Ishpeming. He earned a Bachelor of Science in history with a double minor in music and religious studies from Northern Michigan University. Jonathan then received his Master of Arts in history from Central Michigan University where his research interests included Christianity in the Middle Ages where he narrowed on the formation of the Benedictines, the Cistercian Reforms, and the preaching of the Second Crusade. During his undergraduate and parts of his graduate studies Mr. Korpi focused on the historical development theology of mutual ministry in the Episcopal Diocese of Northern Michigan, and music history, primarily the music of the Reformation.

In the field of sacred music Jonathan studied organ under Dr. Nancy Redfern at Northern Michigan University, Dr. Nathan Knutson and Patrick Burkhart at St. Peter Cathedral in Marquette, MI, and later under Sue Pohlman at Bethel Lutheran Church in Ishpeming. He took one master organ class at CMU under Dr. Steve Egler and then studied under Dr. Mary Lou Nowicki to learn more on Anglican liturgical music. He has served as Bell Choir/ Assistant Director of Music at Bethel Lutheran Church in Ishpeming; Pianist, Organist, and Orchestra Director at St. Joseph Catholic Church; and substitute Organist for area churches. Previously he had performed, and guest conducted in several musical groups in Marquette County.

After moving to Mount Pleasant/Lansing areas, he has served as the Director of Music and Liturgy for St. Mary University Parish in Mt. Pleasant, Director of music and pulpit supply for Rosebush Presbyterian in Rosebush where he was ordained and installed as an elder, and Director of music for Plymouth Congregational Church in Lansing. Jonathan is the current director of music for First Presbyterian Church of Lapeer (PCUSA) in Lapeer, Mi where he directs both the chancel choir and bell choir. Jonathan also serves as a district representative for the Michigan American Choral Director Association. Outside of church music Jonathan is an educator in the public and private school systems. He was the middle school general education teacher for Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School LCMS in Saginaw, middle/high school ELA and History teacher at Huda Upper School in Farmington Hills, sixth-eight grade social studies and music teacher for Mid-Michigan Leadership Academy in Lansing, and currently is a high school World and U.S. History teacher at J.W. Sexton High School in Lansing.


