The Advent Devotionals are ready to order! Follow the QR code by November 28 to reserve your Advent materials






For Families: *Illustrated Advent for Families* is an opportunity for families to take time each week during the Advent season to be intentional and focus on their faith. You'll receive five weekly family devotions, coloring & activity pages, and an Advent calendar. A D.Y.I. Advent Wreath is also included in the free kit.

For Adults: The In Light & Darkness Advent Devotional

is a free weekly devotional based on scripture showing how light and darkness exist together. The short reflections explore the theme of light and darkness in Advent scriptures. How we understand these ideas affects how we view God, our faith, and our world. Inspired by Barbara Brown Taylor's book, *Learning to Walk in the Dark*, we re-frame the traditional binary understanding of light as good and darkness as bad or evil.

We are also offering the opportunity to purchase the book, "Learning to Walk in the Dark", at a cost of \$15.00 per copy, just follow the QR code above. Written by Barbara Brown Taylor, she asks us to put aside our fears and anxieties and to explore all that God has to teach us "in the dark." Often it is in the deepest of dark that we actually see the light. We find courage, we understand the world in new ways, and we feel God's presence around us, guiding us through things seen and unseen.
